Patrons and Presenters



APPC patron **Piers Lane AO** (UK) is a celebrated, engaging, and highly versatile international pianist. He serves as the Artistic Director of the Sydney International Piano Competition and is a popular judge at international competitions. He has an extensive discography for Hyperion.



Adelaide's 2026 Patron, **Eleonora Sivan**, is a Russian-Australian pedagogue who trained at the Leningrad Conservatory. Arriving in 1981, she taught piano at Elder Conservatorium for 23 years. Her inspiring drive and cascading impact stem from her belief that music blossoms from imagination.



Prof. **Konrad Engel** is an internationally renowned concert pianist and professor based in Germany. He won the Chopin-Competition Hanover and has a 40-year performance career across Europe, Asia, and the US. As a pedagogue, he expertly blends methodic experience with psychological and physiological insights.



Prof. **Anna Goldsworthy** is Dean of the Elder Conservatorium and will be Artistic Director of ANAM in 2027. An award-winning pianist, writer, and festival director, she is a founding member of Seraphim Trio. She is best known for her memoir, *Piano Lessons*, and delivered a Boyer Lecture for the ABC in 2024.



Prof. **Nicholas Mathew** is a British-born pianist and the Richard and Rhoda Goldman Distinguished Professor in the Humanities at the University of California, Berkeley. He is a leading authority on 18th and 19th century music, especially Beethoven and Haydn. His books include *Political Beethoven* and *The Haydn Economy*.



Prof. **Pamela Pike** is Associate Dean of Research and Spillman Professor of Piano Pedagogy at Louisiana State University. Winner of LSU's top research and graduate teaching awards, she is a sought-after clinician, editor-in-chief of *Piano Magazine*, and author of two solo books from Routledge.



Dr. Jason Sifford (USA) is a pianist, teacher, and composer, celebrated for engaging performances and insightful lectures spanning classical to jazz. An expert in music for young pianists, his compositions feature in leading syllabi. Currently, Jason is a Director for the Music Teachers National Association.



Carly McDonald champions early music education, innovative teaching, and empowering teachers as small-business owners. Founder of Novar Music and author of Creative.Piano.Professional, she serves as Australasian Ambassador for Piano Adventures and is co-editor of the *I Want To Play That!* piano series.



Samantha Coates, Founder and Director of BlitzBooks, is an internationally regarded author, presenter and pedagogue. She created the *BlitzBooks* series, which invigorated the teaching of theory and sight reading. Her *Rote Repertoire* series transformed the approach to sight reading and improvisation.



Angela Turner is an acclaimed Australian pianist, educator, and broadcast soloist who often performs with the Lyrebird Trio. She lectures at the Queensland Conservatorium and the University of Queensland. She is the consultant for AMEB's Piano Series 19 Grade Books and Hal Leonard publishes her Exploring series.
